Executive Summary

- Grant County and John Day among the **safest communities** in Oregon
 - Index crime rate twice as low as statewide average
 - Zero reported incidence of willful murder, negligent homicide, kidnapping, robbery, arson, prostitution, or illegal gambling
- Community continues to face challenges with **substance abuse**
 - Violations of liquor laws, DUI, and drug laws all exceed statewide average
 - Disorderly conduct and simple assault (related crimes) also exceed average
- **Larceny** continues to be the single largest property crime violation
 - Accounts for 2/3 of all property crime
- **Simple assault** continues to be the largest crime against persons
 - Accounts for 95% of all crimes against persons



Crime Rates (2015)

Grant County's overall crime rate was **19% below** the state average in 2015

- 42% fewer crimes against persons
- 59% fewer crimes against property
- 35% more behavioral crimes

|-------------------|------------------------|-------------------------|-------------------|
| Grant County | 418 per 100,000 | 1197 per 100,000 | 3312 per 100,000 |
| Statewide | 714 per 100,000 | 2911 per 100,000 | 2458 per 100,000 |
| <i>difference</i> | -296 | -1714 | +854 |



Crimes Rates Above State Average (2015)

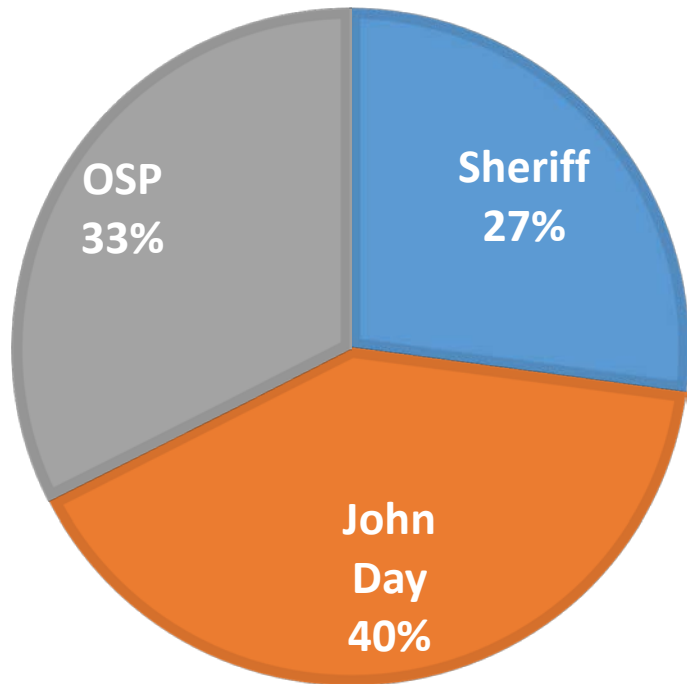
Grant County exceeded the state average in only 6 out of 36 categories:

- Simple assault (12% higher)
- Drug law violations (26% higher)
- All other behavioral crimes (26% higher)
- Disorderly conduct (38% higher)
- DUII (116% higher)
- Liquor law violations (138% higher)

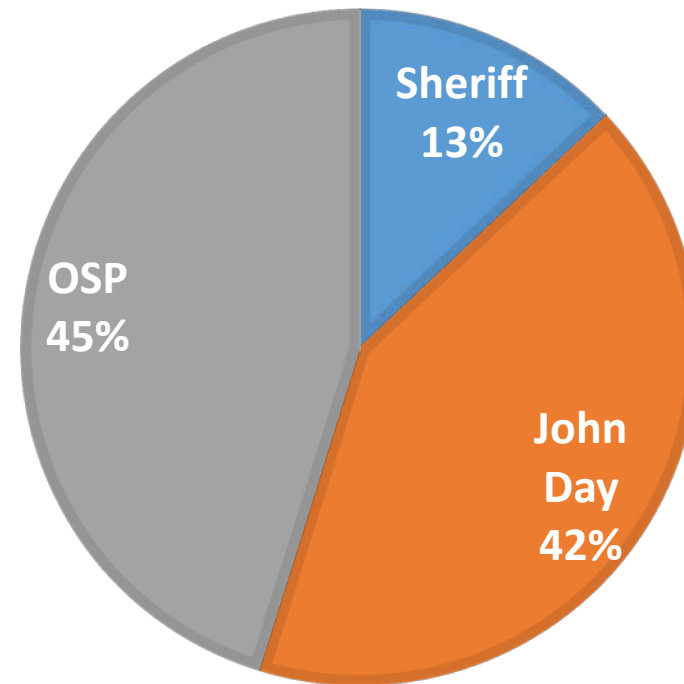


Activity by Agency (2016)

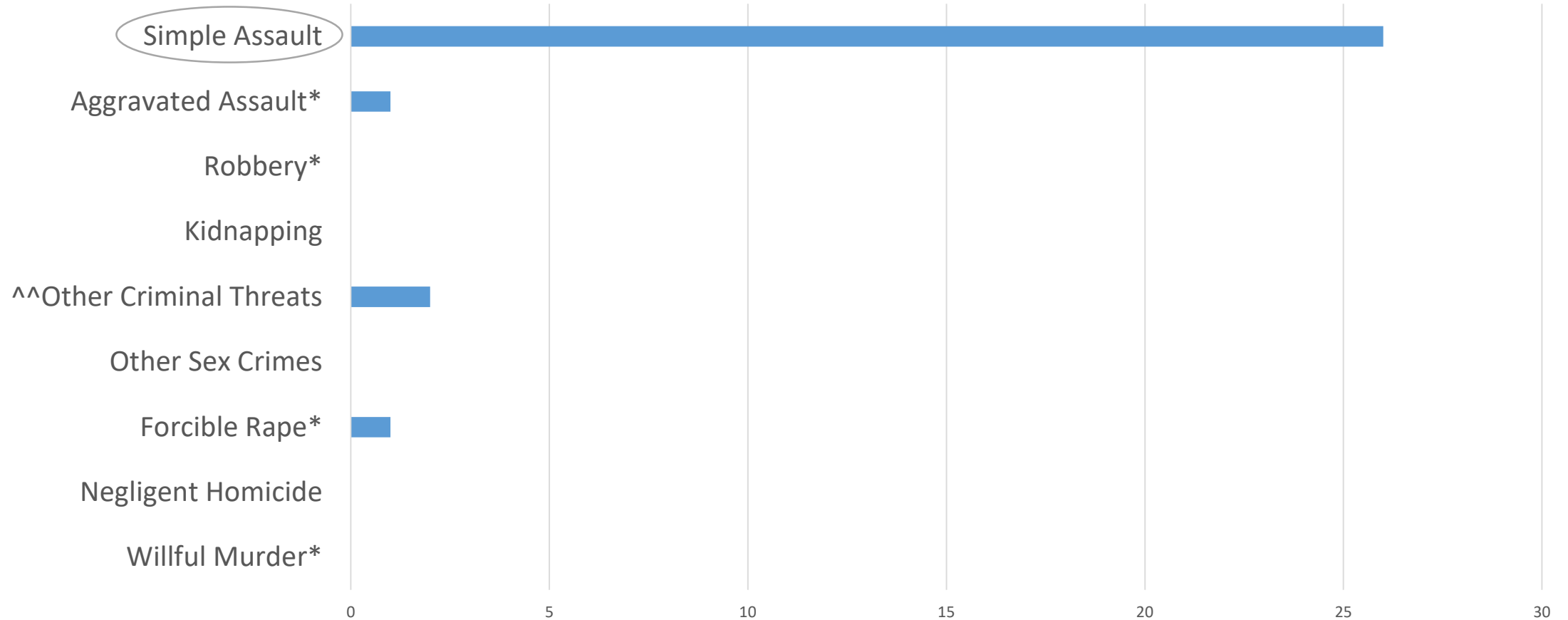

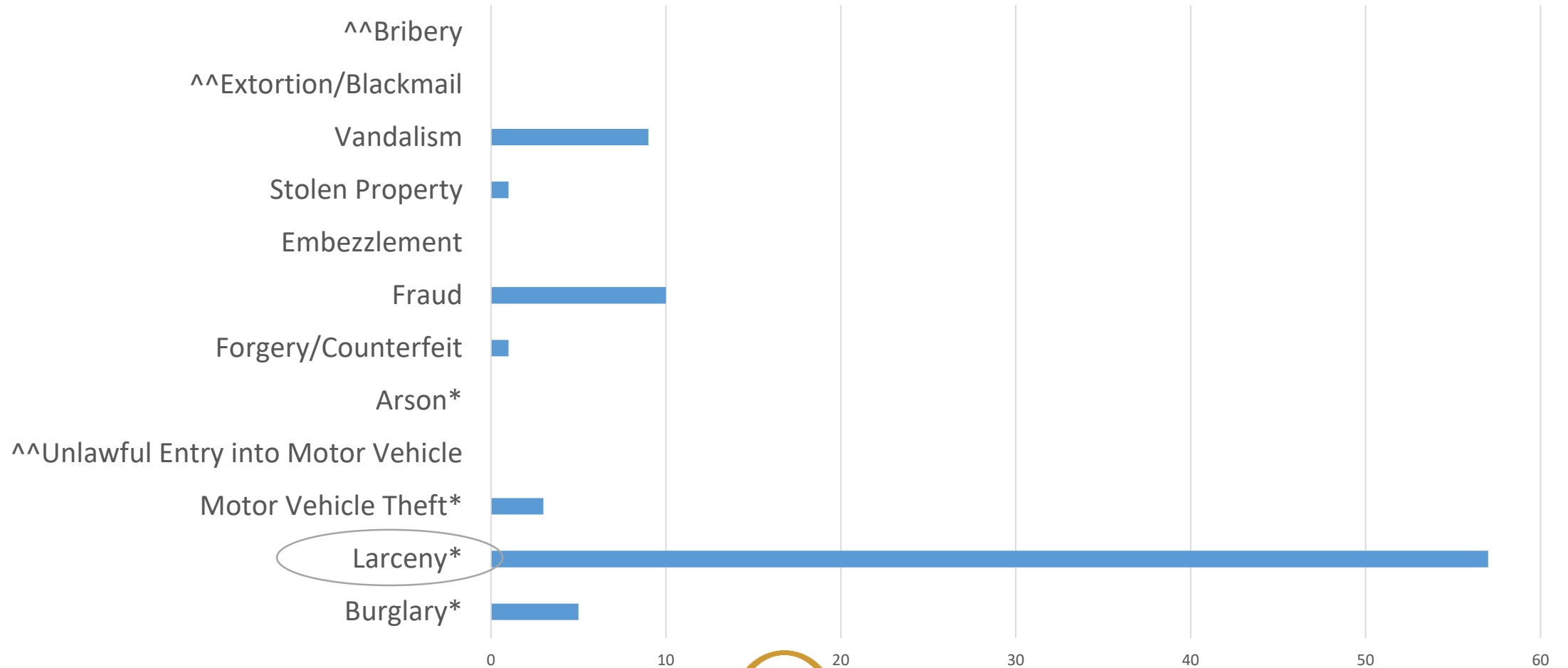

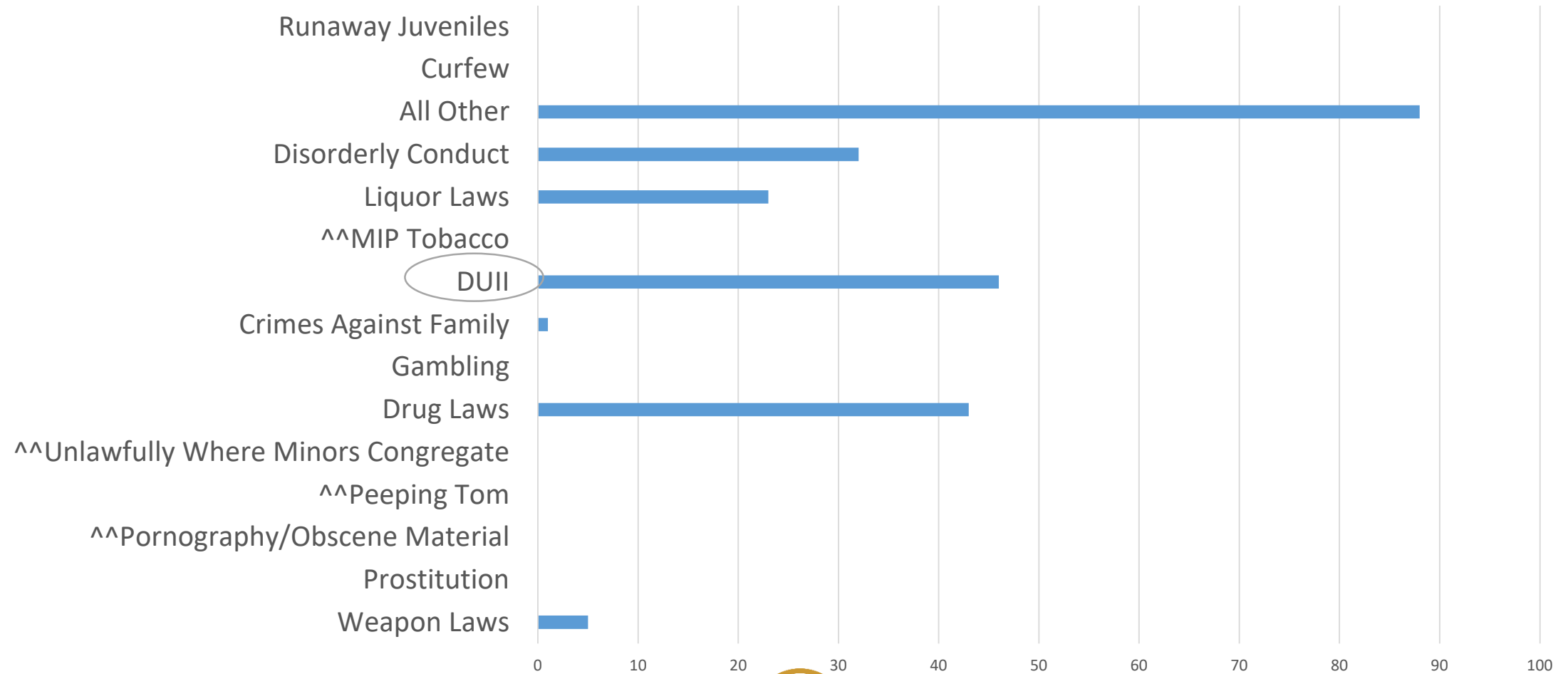
Crimes Against Persons (2015)
