BACKGROUND

Ordinance 18-174-4 ratifies the Grant County Emergency Communications Agency as the new 9-1-1 operating entity, effective January 1, 2019.

The new intergovernmental agreement for 9-1-1 services has also been updated and requires a separate motion for approval.

DISCUSSION

Two action items are needed to transition operating authority of the 9-1-1 center to the Grant County Emergency Communications Agency: an ordinance ratifying the agency and updating the 9-1-1 jurisdiction plan; and approval of a new intergovernmental agreement. These actions will be taken by each organization that is a party to the agreement.

The agreement has gone through multiple iterations and was reviewed by city staff, the 9-1-1 intergovernmental council (IGC) and the 9-1-1 user board. The IGC approved the final agreement at a public meeting held on August 13, 2018.
