#### BACKGROUND

The Oregon Transportation Commission met on January 17, 2019 to review the recommendations from the Safe Routes to Schools (SRS) Committee.

Recommendations were presented to the committee by Amanda Pietz, ODOT Program Implementation and Analysis Manager. She explained that the committee applied scoring criteria established by the OTC during the program rulemaking, and that the scoring was subsequently reviewed by an independent citizen advisory committee. A total of 24 projects were approved in 24 districts; most focused on adding sidewalks, bike lanes and school crossings.

### **DISCUSSION**

The U.S. 395S sidewalk project from SW 6<sup>th</sup> Ave to Grant Union High School was approved by the OTC for \$1,136,000. This funding is in addition to the statewide transportation improvement program (STIP) funding of \$753,705 the city was previously awarded, which will serve as the 40% minimum cost match required under the SRS grant.

To date, the City has spent \$15,414 on this project for engineering and right-of-way acquisition and ODOT has spent \$134,677. As a result of this new grant, the City will have met its financial obligations under the STIP program with funds already expended and ODOT will be able to complete the sidewalk project with no further financial commitment from the City.

This is great news for our community and a tremendous effort on the part of ODOT to take this project on and see it through to completion. It continues to show the state is invested in our success and has been an integral part of our efforts to improve the safety and accessibility of our community.
