BACKGROUND

Two items for approval on the consent agenda: (1) Agreement No. 31244 between the City and ODOT for the US 395 S. Project has been amended and requires council approval; (2) Draft Purchase and Sale Agreement for the Brazil/Morris lot is ready for council approval.

Item 1) Amendment No. 1 to Agreement No. 31244

This amendment reflects the updated project cost estimate of \$2,600,084, which includes MTEP funding limited to \$753,705.38 and Safe Routes to School and Sidewalk Improvement Program funding limited to \$1,640,114. City's funding ratio of 10.27% of MTEP funds (apx. \$75,000 in match) is unchanged from the original agreement. Amendment also inserts terms related to ADA-compliance.

City has contributed \$25,493.73 of the estimated \$75,000 in matching funds as of November 5, 2019. The balance of \$50,000 was originally to be funded by a small cities allotment (SCA) grant awarded in 2016. However, due to changes in the 2017 transportation bill, SCA funds can no longer be used for projects on state highways. As a result, City will be responsible for the full match from its Street Fund. ODOT redirected the \$50,000 SCA grant from 2016 toward the 4th Avenue repairs, so that project should be fully funded with grants, where it normally would require a 20% match from the City. As a result, the net cost of the combined projects is unchanged.

Recommended Action: Approve amendment as submitted.

Item 2) Brazil/Morris Purchase and Sale Agreement

The City contracted with Anderson Perry to do a Phase 1 environmental site assessment on the Brazil/Morris lot prior to acquisition. The ESA identified no hazards of concern and no significant findings.

Enclosed is the draft purchase and sale agreement for the City to purchase the lot for \$60,000. Agreement is subject to final review by the City attorneys, who are working with the title company to remove certain exceptions for purposes of issuing title insurance. Otherwise, the terms are expected to be as noted in the agreement and are consistent with our negotiations and prior council review of this property acquisition.

Recommended Action: Approve the City Manager to sign the Purchase and Sale Agreement and perform all other actions needed to acquire the property, subject to final review and approval by the city attorneys.

BACKGROUND

The City has applied for and received 23 grants for \$12.5 million since 2016. Nine of these grants have been successfully completed and are now closed. The remaining 14 are active. An additional 10 grants are pending submission. This memo updates the council on the status of these grants.

COMPLETED GRANTS

The nine grants that are now closed out are listed at the top of the enclosed report. They include: the Oregon Pine Phase 1 environmental site assessment; Weaver Building purchase and hazardous substance abatement; treatment plant facility plan update and feasibility study; technical assistance grant to create the John Day housing incentive program/urban renewal agency; 911 grant to operate and relocate the 911 center; the Innovation Gateway trails (phase 1) project, and; the Business Oregon grant to create the City's community investment strategy, housing strategy and to host regional economic diversification summit.

These completed grants came to \$944,100 in total funding expended and on average took one year and four months (498 days) to manage from award notice to closeout. This period does not include the front-end application process, which varies by grant.

GRANTS AWARDED AND IN-PROGRESS

The 14 grants in the current portfolio relate to a variety of capital projects. They include:

- Innovation Gateway Area Plan (TGM grant pending closeout)
- CEDS/REDS Plan (EDA grant pending closeout)
- 395S Sidewalk Enhance Project (funded through MTEP and Safe Routes to Schools grants)
- April 2019 Flooding and Street Repairs (funded through ODOT and FEMA)
- Charolais Heights Intersection (SCA grant)
- 395S Sidewalk Enhance Project (MTEP grant)
- Wastewater Facility Engineering (CDBG grant)
- Len's Drug Revitalization (Oregon Main Street grant)
- Oregon Main Street Conference (Nonprofit agency grant, pending closeout)
- Integrated Park System (OPRD grant)
- Aquatic Center Planning and Feasibility Study (OPRD grant)
- USDA ReConnect (granted to OTC, City to provide match)

Four of these 14 grants are managed by or were awarded to external agencies, with the City contributing matching funds and project oversight. Grants in this category include: the TGM grant (ODOT managed); 395S Safe Routes to School grant (ODOT managed); and USDA ReConnect (OTC managed). The CDBG grant was awarded to the City but is managed by a contracted grant administrator.

PENDING GRANTS

The City has 10 potential grants pending. They are:

- 2019 USDA Community Connect Grant (\$3 million, broadband)
- Business Oregon Brownfield Redevelopment Grants (\$105,000, Innovation Gateway)
- Business Oregon Water/Wastewater Grant (\$750,000, treatment plant)
- USDA Wastewater Environmental Program (WEP) Grant (\$TBD, treatment plant)
- USDA Community Facilities Grant (\$TBD, community pavilion)
- Ford Family Foundation Grant (\$TBD, community pavilion)
- EDA Economic Recovery Grant (\$TBD, broadband and community development projects)
- CDBG Housing/Disaster Recovery Grant (\$TBD, housing improvements)
- OPRD Veterans & War Memorials Grant 2020 (\$TBD, battlefield cross/veterans memorial at Davis Creek park)
- 2020 BUILD grant (\$TBD, street improvements)

These grants will be submitted this fiscal year with award decisions next fiscal year. We will discuss these applications in detail during our meeting.
