BACKGROUND

The city council agreed to issue up to a \$5,000 water credit to the parks and recreation district for the splashpad. The agreement was stated the credit would be issued contingent on the parks district opening the splashpad by Memorial Day and closing it after Labor Day. This year, due to COVID-19, the splashpad did not open until July 8th. Historically, we have also issued a credit for the initial pool filling.

Construction has begun at the 7th Street area for the parking lot and Sisul Engineering has completed the preliminary design for the Hill Park trails that will connect to the 7th Street parking area.

DISCUSSION

The Parks & Rec District would like to discuss a pro-rated credit for 2020 based on their actual water usage.

- **Gleason Park & Pool.** We switched the meter back to the City's account on August 8th at the end of our 25-year agreement and issued a credit for all utility charges from that date forward, so that Parks & Rec's charges ended on the date of the agreement, with credit issued on 09/16 for the partial month from August 08 through the end of the billing cycle. They used 209,650 gallons in July and 183,430 gallons used in August due to irrigation at Gleason Park and have a balance due of \$358.67.
- 7th Street Splashpad & Restroom. The motion the council made was to issue a \$5,000 water credit for the splashpad provided it opened by Memorial Day and remained open through Labor Day. We are showing the splashpad opened on/around July 10th. The District used 133,850 gallons in July and 291,620 gallons in August; we won't know September's usage until we read the meters on Tuesday. Water bills for July (\$436.94) and August (\$926.02) total \$1,362.96

Construction has begun at the 7th Street area for the parking lot. Initial grading and excavation plus utility marking and trenching for the future electrical/water and fiberoptic conduit is complete. Sisul's preliminary design for the Hill Family Park and connector trails is enclosed for council review and discussion.

If council concurs with the design, the engineers will begin preparing the Site Design Review packet for the next Planning Commission hearing.
