Approved Project Description

Repairs to 4th Avenue (Airport Access) road to restore the facility back to its pre-disaster function and capacity. The City will remove and replace the asphalt road surface and repair and replace an area of the collapsed gravel road base. Additionally, based on the road's current alignment and integral ground lost as a result of the severe storms and to avoid encroaching into the existing creek channel, construction will include reducing the cross sectional area of Canyon Creek, and elevating the regulated 100-year base flood elevation. A soldier pile retaining wall with variable height will be installed in order to avoid closing the road and to avoid risks of destabilizing the uphill slopes.
