


Parking only


Do you think there is a problem with oversize parking on Main Street?

If you think there is a problem, do you think additional signage to parking lots, no parking paint on curbs and no oversize parking signs are enough to solve it?



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
Do you think that an additional parking lot that would accommodate oversize vehicles at city hall would be helpful if there was a bus stop there?





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Do you think that there is already enough parking currently, given the bus stops that the People Mover has installed in the last several years?








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Do you think the city needs to look for additional areas to build parking lots?
